

- Vision Statement

- Mission Statement
 - To collectively advance and grow provincial product management programs in Saskatchewan



PURPOSE:

- Advance RS as a collaboration of provincial product management programs
- Support responsible recycling in Saskatchewan
- Promote the awareness of RS recycling due to RS member programs
- Enhance public relations to advance a strong image for RS member programs and the concept of recycling in Saskatchewan





- the recycling division of SARC
- established in 1988 to collect beverage containers
- has collected 6 billion beverage containers
- 71 depots in 63 communities
- Recycled containers are made into various products





- SARRC was incorporated in February 1996
- •Has recycled nearly 250 million litres of used oil, 28 million oil filters and 4,000 tonnes of containers
- •300 recycling locations and large quantity pick-up
- •Will be adding antifreeze, antifreeze containers, diesel exhaust fluid containers and diesel fuel filters in early 2014
- Administers the EHC to cover program costs
- Collected material is recycled



SASKATCHEWAN SCRAPTION CORPORATION

- SSTC started in 1998
- Collect tires bicycle, cars, trucks, construction
- Black Gold Rush and R2R
- Over 1350 retailer participants
- Funding is through a TRF on new tires
- Tires recycled into new marketable materials





- SPRP started in 2006
- Collects household paints, stains and varnishes
- Operated by Product Care a non-profit association of paint manufacturers, distributors and retailers
- Collected at the 71 SARCAN Depots
- Program is funded by Eco-fees on paint when it is purchased
- Since inception has recycled nearly 2 million litres
- Paint that is not reused is made into other products





- SWEEP started in 2007 to collect and recycle end-of-life electronics
- Uses the 71 SARCAN depots and collection events
- Regina Food Bank handles ICI sectors
- Computers for Schools approved for reuse
- Since 2007 has collected 16,000 tonnes of material
- Levies EHF to cover the cost of the program
- Transitioned to EPRA in April 2013
- Materials are used in the manufacturing of new products



• In 2012 Recycle Saskatchewan Members diverted:

- 19,237,478 litres of waste liquids; and

 48,964 tonnes of waste materials from Saskatchewan landfills
